The Civic Innovation Platform is a project initiated by the Policy Lab Digital, Work and Society at the German Federal Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs (BMAS) and forms part of the German Federal Government's Artificial Intelligence (AI) Strategy. It aims to create favourable underlying conditions for social innovation based on AI technologies through absorbing impulses from the middle of society and promoting civic innovation processes. For new dynamics to arise in a society, not only good ideas and commitment are needed, but also infrastructures, resources, visibility, and space for testing prototypes.

home and the "AI is what we make it!" idea contest, the project offers ideational and financial support for individuals and organisations from business, public administration, and civil society who wish to jointly develop ideas for AI providing benefits for the common good and, in doing so, advance social progress.

The "Al is what we make it!" idea contest aims at all those who want to use Al to advance social progress. The idea behind it is to support the creation process from the outset. Once a year, project teams can submit their project outlines to apply for financial support of up to 20,000 euros to help them work on their concepts. In 2023 the idea contest will be supplemented with a funding programme that will provide the project partnerships with long-term financial support too as well as ideational support in the form of advice, assistance, and workshops.
